CATALOG DESCRIPTION: Simulated patient care provides an opportunity to develop progressively complex nursing skills. Emphasis is placed on sterile technique, airway maintenance, nutritional and fluid support, elimination devices, specimen collection, medication administration, and drug dosage calculations.

MAJOR COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES: Upon successful completion of this course the student will be expected to:

1. Safely demonstrate progressively complex nursing skills utilized in meeting needs of patients.
2. Demonstrate competencies in techniques necessary to maintain a safe patient care environment.
3. Apply principles of handwritten and computerized documentation to record simulated patient care.
4. Demonstrate therapeutic communication techniques.
5. Demonstrate proficiency in drug dosage calculations and medication administration.
