CATALOG DESCRIPTION: Provides an understanding of the health care needs of adults experiencing non-complex alterations in health within the context of all body systems. Examines the roles of the licensed practical nurse and the registered nurse in applying the nursing process and implementing the ordered plan of treatment.

1. Analyze the roles of the licensed practical nurse and registered nurse in relation to nursing care of adults.

4. Discuss the health teaching needs of adults and their significant others.
